


Want to stretch yourself and try a new challenge at home? Have a go at one of these language challenge tasks!

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| <p>Choose an object from your house.</p> <p>Imagine that object was discovered in 100 years time, what would the label for the object say in a museum?</p> | <p>Research an historical figure. What important events have happened to you?</p> | <p>Draw yourself in different outfits from periods of history e.g. The Vikings, the Stone Age, The Victorians, The Aztecs, The Romans, The Egyptians</p> |
| <p>Draw a map of your local area. Use symbols to show key places. You could use official OS symbols or create your own. Don't forget to include a key.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvsfr82/articles/zidkhhk</p> | <p>Write a diary entry for a day in the life of...</p> <p>A Greek soldier A WW2 evacuee A Viking warrior A Victorian maid or butler</p> | <p>Create a wordsearch of key geographical words linked to maps, globes and atlases.</p> <p>e.g. map, compass, hemisphere, equator, latitude, longitude.</p> | <p>Using a double bubble, compare Britain now to a different period of time. E.g. Victorians</p>  | <p>Packing for an adventure! Two explorers are going on an expedition – one to Antarctic and one to Africa. What do they pack? Draw and label pictures in a backpack.</p> | <p>Make a model or a painting of a well known British landmark or monument eg. Stonehenge, Angel of the North, Uffington White horse.</p> |
| <p>Flags of the world. Draw and colour a flag for one country in each continent. Challenge: design a flag for one of the 7 continents eg. Antarctica could have icebergs and penguins!</p> | <p>Food, glorious food! Compare the food from 2 different countries. You could create 2 plates and draw food on each one. Can your family guess where each plate is from?</p> | <p>Keep a weather diary for the week. You could make weather signs (eg. Snow, sun, hail, rain)and give your family a weather forecast. Hopefully there will be at least one sunny day!</p> | <p>A special place. Have you got or dream of a special place where you would go to have fun? What does it look like? What can you do there?</p> | <p>Design a treasure map of an imaginary place. Consider the physical features eg. Rivers, mountains, caves. Can you use the symbols a real map has? Where's the treasure hidden? Write a set of instructions for someone to find it.</p> | <p>Famous explorers. We know so much about our world thanks to famous and daring explorers. Research the internet and books to find facts about an explorer and present the facts in a fact file or a powerpoint presentation.</p> |
